(b) Emergency drills- (1) Man overboard: No sea painter rigged; lifeboats not used, and in some cases not provided; lack of familiarity with use of steering oar; confusion amongst crew on man actually falling overboard. (2) Abandon ship: Boats not properly outfitted; unfamiliarity of men with stations. (3) Collision drill: Proper provision not made in watch, quarter, and station bill; men not familiar with duties, stations, and necessary gear. (4) Fire drill: Pressure not...
